In 1890, Rudolph Diesel invented the engine that we know as Diesel. It was originally built to run on pure plant oils. However, about that time the petro industry was making great headway, and the fuel that came to be known as diesel was so much less money than plant oils were shelved. We are only now taking them off the shelf because the cost of veggie is now becoming competitive with the cost of petrochemical diesel. Jim told of the start up cost of \$3,600 to smell like McDonalds.

Many people running vegetable oil in their vehicles collect used cooking oil from restaurants, grocery stores and other institutions that use oil in their fryers. By filtering the oil and ensuring that is free of water, what was once a waste product is now recycled, renewable fuel. The oil is filtered down to 10 microns.

Running straight vegetable oil in a diesel requires installing a heated, parallel fuel system. Tapping into the engine cooling system and routing the excess heat given off by the engine to the SVO system is the most efficient way to heat the oil.
