The Pasadena house is 1 of 4 in the Southern California area. The house is a large, two-story, fully restored 1912 Craftsman style home. It is like a Bed & Breakfast with 7 unique bedrooms. The homes were built by the then Governor of California for his 2 daughters. The homes are in the path of the yet to be finished freeway going through So. Pasadena. They are leased from Caltrans for \$7,000 per month.

The house is the youngest and the smallest of the 260 in the world. It came to be after Marchelle Sellers felt the need for a home for families with children who are facing major health needs. It only took her 7 years to get the permits and funding. Their budget is \$587,000 per year with an all volunteer staff. There is a nominal \$15 charge per night, but no family is ever turned away based on their ability to pay.
