Elizabeth Dever is the House Director at the Pasadena Ronald McDonald House near Huntington Hospital. Elizabeth is responsible for community outreach, fundraising, guest and family services. She joined the organization in September of 2009, previously working at Shriners Hospital for Children. 20% of their funding comes from McDonalds Restaurants and their suppliers. The average stay is 10.6 days per family.

Ronald McDonald Houses around the world offer families a way to stay together, in proximity to the treatment hospital, and be comfortable and cared for during their stay. Families are stronger when they are together which helps in the healing process. By staying at a Ronald McDonald House, parents can also can better communicate with their child's medical team and keep up with complicated treatment plans when needed.

The Pasadena House is made up of two large, two-story, fully restored 1912 Craftsman style homes. The houses are designed much like a quaint Bed & Breakfast to provide a comfortable atmosphere in a home-like setting. The home offers 10 private, unique bedrooms, 2 large kitchens and pantries, family room and quiet areas with a lush garden.
