Elizabeth Devers is the director of the Ronald McDonald House in Pasadena near Huntington Memorial Hospital. Our club has been supporting their efforts for years by providing meals to parents and families of children that are facing some difficult times in the hospital. When a family has been at the hospital all day the last thing they need to worry about is their next meal. They can serve up to twelve families at once with a 98% occupancy rate.

They provide their services from two craftsman homes from 1910-1912 that they rent from Caltrans for \$6,000 a month. Their budget is \$550,000 a year with about 15% coming from McDonalds franchises and the balance from donations. They are celebrating their 10th year in Pasadena having served almost 13,000 children and families from all over the world. They will have their Walk For Kids on Sunday, April 12 at Exposition Park.

Pancake Chairman Dan Arrighi brought everything and everyone together to serve 242 adults and 24 children. If you have not given your pancake money to Jim Robuck please do so now as we are short of last year's numbers. On a good note we sold \$350 in raffle tickets for our barbecue.
