People For People began their life saving work of help on March 1, 1984. They serve the cities of Alhambra (557), San Gabriel (836), Rosemead (971), Temple City (249), and Monterey Park with 198.

They were on the verge of extinction until Rosemead gave them some CDBG funds to keep them going. They receive in-kind donations from Albertson's Market, Trader Joe's, Claro's, Pizza Hut, Starbucks, and the Food Bank Heal Program (Healthy Elderly Adults for Life). This is a program that is giving seniors extra food each month besides what they receive for PFP.

The Postal Food Drive will take place this year on Saturday, May 11. We will be helping collect, sort, and deliver the food directly to their warehouse in San Gabriel.

They receive their funding through foundations and grants, in-kind donations, with an annual budget of \$118,000.
