We will be hosting 12 visitors who will be given a tour of Temple City Kiwanis. The breakfast is from 7:30 to 9:00 a.m at the Women's Clubhouse at the corner of Kauffman and Woodruff (immediately north of the fire station). We will not be meeting for lunch at the Bahooka. The membership committee has done a wonderful job of planning this event. The future of Temple City Kiwanis depends on each one of us supporting Dan Snell and his committee.

LAST TUESDAY

Damien Allen is the Director of Corporate and Community Sponsorships for SGV Habitat For Humanity. Damien comes from the east coast with a background in construction. Accompanying Damien was Sandy Yu, in charge of Fund Development.

Habitat builds and rehabilitates houses with the help of volunteer labor and partner families. Habitat homes are sold to families without profit and are financed by affordable no-interest loans. The homeowners' 1% down payments and monthly mortgage payments go into a revolving "Fund for Humanity" that is used to build more houses. Each homeowner family invests at least 500 sweat equity hours into the building of their house and the houses of others.

A three bedroom, 1.5 bath Habitat house in the SGV costs the family an average of \$150,000. Prices will differ slightly depending on locations, cost of land, labor and materials. The monthly payments are not more than 30% of the family's gross monthly income.

Habitat will be entering into an agreement with Temple City to rehabilitate 5 homes. The city currently has a Handyworker Program where they invest in 5 homes at \$10,000 each. The funds can do so much more with the Habitat partnership. All the labor is donated and you can usually get about \$18,000 of repairs from that initial \$10,000. Eventually it would be great if we could get a piece of land to actually build some homes for needy families. Jerry Backstrom and Steve Montesanti have helped on a recent build in Monrovia.

John Chandler (secret handshake for the day) would like our club to visit Maryvale Orphanage in Rosemead on April 27. We will have lunch there and take a guided tour of their beautiful grounds. We will not be meeting at the Bahooka that Tuesday.

Sue Matchett paid \$\$ for the purchase of a 1967 Volkswagon Bug. Janice Murasko presented a huge poster with students notes of thanks for our club's contribution to the "Baby, Think It Over" program at Temple City High School. Also a big thanks to Steve and Monica Tyre for their contribution.
