Chris Golder and Colleen McKernan from Foothill HomeCare Partners were the speakers for the day. Their company provides affordable assistance to families in caring for elderly loved ones by providing compassionate, expert care on an hourly or live-in basis. Some of the things they provide are transportation, meal planning and preparation, personal care, shopping and errands, light housekeeping, laundry, medication reminders, exercise and walking.

Some things that I learned was that as you age your sense of smell and taste diminishes. Some seniors are consuming rotten or expired food and do not even know it. Most of the accidents that take place in the home take place in the bathroom. Your medical information should be posted on the refrigerator, this is the first place that life saving personnel look. Some of the hot issues today are elder abuse. 67% of adult abuse are committed by their own family members. If you notice that a senior has unexplained bruises, or their personal hygiene is lacking, or something just doesn't seem right then you can make a report to the Adult Protective Services. After CLC Principal Stephen Edo left he won the See's candy gift from our speaker. I was charged with the responsibility of delivering it to him. I am sorry to say that after repeated attempts to deliver I finally had to enjoy the candy myself.

Those paying bragging fines for the day were: Dan Snell who celebrates is 88th birthday, I paid mistakenly for being in the club 39 years, Chuck Souder paid for UCLA losing to USC.
