Ron Garcia Public Affairs Region Manager for Southern California Edison. He has been with them for 43 years working his way up from lineman to his current position. He is also a former member of the Maywood Bell Kiwanis Club.

Ron lives in Santa Paula and has a wonderful pony tail that he is growing so he can donate the hair for a wig. Ron lost his daughter to cancer and is doing his part to honor her memory.

In 1957 Ron began his career with Edison at \$3.21 per hour. He was making over \$30,000 per year so you know he was putting in a lot of time. In the old days you had a home with a TV, ice box, and a few lamps. Now we have plasma TV's in every room, all kinds of kitchen electrical appliances, a deep freezer in the garage. It is getting more difficult for Edison to supply the energy for all our goodies. In 1957 1 megawatt supplied about 2,000 homes, now only about 650.

Some things we learned were: the old incandescent light bulbs and going to be a thing of the past. Eventually you will only be able to use the CFL (Compact Fluorescent Lights) Bulbs. You may qualify for a 20% discount through California Alternate Rate Energy (CARE),
