Nearly 1.4 million lawsuits are filed in California every year. Fact: In one fiscal year alone, three of California's five largest school districts paid \$32.8 million in litigation costs. Fact: Nearly 75 percent of small business owners fear they may be forced to consider closing their businesses due to the threat of a lawsuit.
