THIS TUESDAY

Temple City Community Development Manager Joe Lambert will give an update on all the proposed changes facing Temple City. Joe has spoken to us before. Come prepared with your questions.

Cinco de Mayo (Spanish for "Fifth of May") is a regional holiday in Mexico, primarily celebrated in the state of Puebla, with some limited recognition in other parts of Mexico. The holiday commemorates the Mexican army's unlikely defeat of French forces at the Battle of Puebla on May 5, 1862, under the leadership of Mexican General Ignacio Zaragoza Seguín.

The Battle was significant for at least two reasons. First, while outnumbered almost two-to-one, the Mexicans defeated a much better-equipped French army that had known no defeat for almost 50 years. Second, this battle was important because it would be "the last time that an army from another continent invaded the Americas." While significant, Cinco de Mayo is not an obligatory federal holiday in Mexico.

The hospital takes care of about 60,000 emergency room patients each year with over half of them being admitted to one of the 390 beds.
