## THIS TUESDAY

Jack Stamph will speak about The Gamble House in Pasadena. It is an outstanding example of American Arts and Crafts style architecture. The house and furnishings were designed by Charles and Henry Greene in 1908 for David and Mary Gamble of the Procter and Gamble Company. The house, a National Historic Landmark, is owned by the City of Pasadena and operated by the University of Southern California and is open for public tours.

## LAST WEEK

Norene and Tom Rand gave us the facts and figures of how People For People headquartered in San Gabriel helps the less fortunate. PFP started in 1984 with one paid person and 12 volunteers. Last year they served 547 families from Alhambra, 111 from Monterey Park, 1,337 from Rosemead, 173 from Temple City, 708 from San Gabriel, and 514 homeless.

In-Kind gifts come from Starbucks, Pizza Hut, Claro's Market, and Trader Joe's. Many of these items have to be picked up several times a week, often late into the evening. The wish lists include a 10,000 sq ft building, someone to pay the Edison bills during the summer, ink for their printers and copy machine, and VOLUNTEERS.

Speaking of Volunteers, the Letter Carrier Food Drive took place last Saturday. The stats are 16 gurneys of food, 7,127 lbs. sorted and transported with volunteers Jim Enkelaar, John Gera, Mike Miller, Steve Montesanti, and Dan Snell.
