**LAST TUESDAY**

Charlie Martin, Veteran City Attorney/ City Manager along with another veteran city council member, Cathé Wilson, gave a somewhat grim view of local politics.

Some interesting facts: There are 37 vacant stores on Las Tunas. Of the 306 business licenses, only 26% are sales tax producers. Of the 10 top sales tax producers in Temple City, 7 are in the redevelopment district (Rosemead and Las Tunas) the other 3 are gas stations and the 99 cent store. Temple City produces about \$42 per capita in sales tax revenue, compared with about \$400 for Monrovia.

The feds are saying we need to produce 976 housing units by 2014. This would take 6 square blocks, the fines are \$10,000 per day for non-compliance.

If Proposition 98 fails TC will be in a world of hurt for redevelopment. Eminent domain will not be available for redevelopment.

**MEMORIAL DAY MONDAY**

Memorial Day is a United States Federal Holiday that is observed on the last Monday of May. It was formerly known as Decoration Day. This holiday commemorates U.S. men and women who have died in military service to their country. It began first to honor Union soldiers who died during the American Civil War. After World War I, it was expanded to include those who died in any war or military action.

Many people observe this holiday by visiting cemeteries and memorials. A national moment of remembrance takes place at 9 p.m. US Eastern time. Another tradition is to fly the U.S. flag at half-staff from dawn until noon local time. Volunteers place an American flag upon each gravesite located in a National Cemetery.

Memorial Day formerly occurred on May 30, and some, such as the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) and Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (SUVCW), advocate returning to this fixed date, although the significance of the date is tenuous. The VFW stated in a 2002 Memorial Day Address, "Changing the date merely to create three-day weekends has undermined the very meaning of the day. No doubt, this has contributed a lot to the general public's nonchalant observance of Memorial Day.
