Donald Dodd told us all about the City of Los Angeles Fire Department Historical Society Museum and Gift Shop. It's LAFD Fire Station at 1355 No. Cahuenga Avenue, Hollywood, CA. Bob Lee, our Lt. Gov. In 1871 the City started with volunteers (like today's Sierra Madre). In 1886 the Los Angeles Fire Department started.
