He obtained a law degree from UCLA Law School and presently works as a Deputy District Attorney for the County of Los Angeles where he prosecutes felony and misdemeanor jury trials and juvenile adjudications, elder fraud, physical elder abuse, child abuse, sexual assault, and domestic violence cases.

In addition to his position with the DA's office, John is also a member of the Tempe City unifies School District Board of Education and is currently serving as President. He has two daughters who attend Temple City schools. Prior to becoming a member of the Board of Education, he served as Chair of the Longden School Site Council. He has also served as a coach and a referee with Temple City AYSO soccer.

With over 1,000 District Attorney's in Los Angeles County, John Pomeroy has the unique job of helping the defenceless, our senior citizens from financial and physical abuse. The Office of the City Attorney Elder Crimes Unit is a specialized vertical prosecution unit that pursues both criminal and civil actions to enforce laws that protect the elderly and dependent adults. The Elder Crimes Unit prosecutes financial crimes committed against elderly victims, as well as crimes of physical and financial abuse occurring in nursing homes and long-term care facilities. The Elder Crimes Unit also pursues civil actions against nursing homes engaged in illegal business practices such as inaccurate record keeping and failure to safeguard residents' belongings.
