Specialties include: Refuse Removal and Recycling Services, American Organics - Certified Organic Composting Facility, Street Sweeping, Mixed Waste (Commingled) Processing. Jerry's factoids: Community Disposal's Chet Otting sold to Athens. Street sweeping started in Temple City in 1986.

Ed graduated from TCHS in 2000 and then attending University of California, Santa Barbara earning his BA in law and society. Ed speaks Taiwanese and Mandarin which really came in handy at our last Lunar New Year Celebration. He is on the City's Planning Commission and also a former TCUSD School Board member, aide to Senator Bob Margett and worked on Steve Cooley's campaign. Ed is now in charge of Government Affairs for Athens making sure that TC is held harmless for \$10,000 a day fines for not meeting the 50% State AB939 recycling mandates. Of all the city's Athens contracts for, Temple City and Palos Verdes Estates are the only ones that have twice a week pick-up. They are busy coming up with new ways of getting rid of the trash as Puente Hills Landfill will be closing August 2013.
