LAST TUESDAY

Janice Murasko has been a teacher in the district for 29 years and has taught English, journalism, and drama. She is now teaching Teen Living and is the Community Service Director. Janice was also a former member of our club having been President in 2000.

Janice presented "Baby, think it over". Janice along with students Ali Blank and Christopher Mendez showed what it is like to do all the things you normally do for a baby, including feeding, burping, changing diapers, and to find out why it is crying. I can see why they cost so much. These babies are very life-like, including breathing and electronic diapers.

These technology advanced electronic life like babies cost about \$950 each and record your every move including how many times the baby was shaken or its head was not supported properly, or how many times you put the feeding bottle to its mouth. There are 5 babies available for Janices' 2 classes. 60 students go through the 5 week program allowing them to take the babies home and care for them. Electronic monitoring devices do not allow them to just hand the baby off to someone else.

Janice has been helped by the Schools Foundation for the purchase of a new baby but is looking for new sponsors since this is not funded by the district. In my opinion this is a worthwhile project teaching young students what lies before you if you have a baby before you are ready. The girls have a real mother instinct while the boys return the baby at an arms distance. It would be great if in the real world babies cost only \$950.

I think all Janice has to do is tell her young students it takes about \$250,000 from birth to 18 years old. And that is if everything goes well.
