Dr. Joe not only has compassion for his furry patients but also volunteers his services and staff for the annual Temple City sponsored Rabies Clinic each summer at Temple City Park. In one evening over 400 of Temple City's cats and dogs get their rabies shots. Dr. Joe is the official Vet for Honorary Member Lynne Burkhardt's therapy dog Liberty.

Dr. Pavlik was very warm and kind as always, and gave my dog a clean bill of health.
