Mike stated that because of the lack of housing inventory the following scenario usually takes place: 1) list the house on Monday, 2) write an ad on Thursday, 3) submit to the newspapers on Friday, 4) hold open house Saturday and Sunday. If the house has not sold by Monday it is overpriced. That's when Mike says "I'm workin on it".

Roger Lopez is a Reverse Mortgage specialist with Associated Mortgage Bankers. A Reverse Mortgage is a government insured home loan that allows you to convert a portion of the equity in your home into tax free cash. Unlike a traditional mortgage or home equity loan, the homeowner is under no obligation to make monthly payments.

All borrowers must be 62 or older. You must occupy the home as a primary residence, and your home does not need to be paid off to qualify. The loan has to be repaid if you move to a new principal address, the last surviving borrower passes away, don't pay your property taxes, fail to live in the house for 12 consecutive months, and of course if you sell the house. You can get the money in one lump sum, monthly payments, line of credit, or a combination.
