Our fearless program chairman for June, Jim Enkelaar promises another interesting program. Unfortunately, he is not willing to share it with me. We will all be surprised.

Now that's dedication! Even though school has finished for Emperor they will be with us this Tuesday for their last Students of the Month.

LAST TUESDAY

Just when you think you know everything about another member, you learn something new. After Jim Enkelaar read my story last week about D-Day, little did we know he actually LIVED IT!

Jim gave the eyewitness account of how an 11 year old boy saw his house actually being used as a "hiding place" for many Jews escaping the concentration camps.

Jim said, "In 1940 the Germans invaded the Netherlands by air and on the ground. We knew the second world war had started. We saw German bombers fly over our town on their way to Rotterdam Harbor. A part of the city was destroyed as well.

The Queen of the Netherlands and her family went into exile in England. The small Dutch army was outnumbered by the huge German army and after 9 days they surrendered. The Germans occupied our school and we had to study in the church that my father pastored. 20 to 40 year old men were picked up and taken to Germany to work in factories to make war material, because most of the German men were drafted to fight the enemy.

Many Jews were taken to concentration camps and gas chambers. They had to wear the Star of David so the Germans could recognize them.

Anne Frank and her family were hiding in a hiding place in Amsterdam. In our parsonage we were hiding 3 Jews in my dad's study at night. The hiding place was between the ceiling and floor of the attic. A small BBC radio and some food was there as well, so they knew what was happening in Europe

There was a shortage of food in our country, the Germans took cows, pigs, bread, cheese, ham, chickens, and milk to Germany. We were hungry and lost weight.

On May 5, 1945 the Americans and Canadians liberated us. In November 1958 my wife and I emigrated to a FREE AMERICA!"

THE STORY OF FATHERS DAY

Father's Day, contrary to popular misconception, was not established as a holiday in order to help greeting card manufacturers sell more cards. In fact when a "father's day" was first proposed there were no Father's Day cards!

Mrs. John B. Dodd, of Washington, first proposed the idea of a "father's day" in 1909. Mrs. Dodd wanted a special day to honor her father, William Smart. William Smart, a Civil War veteran, was widowed when his wife (Mrs. Dodd's mother) died in childbirth with their sixth child. Mr. Smart was left to raise the newborn and his other five children by himself on a rural farm in eastern Washington state. It was after Mrs. Dodd became an adult that she realized the strength and selflessness her father had shown in raising his children as a single parent.

The first Father's Day was observed on June 19, 1910 in Spokane Washington. At about the same time in various towns and cities across America other people were beginning to celebrate a "father's day." In 1924 President Calvin Coolidge supported the idea of a national Father's Day. Finally in 1966 President Lyndon Johnson signed a presidential proclamation declaring the 3rd Sunday of June as Father's Day.

Father's Day has become a day to not only honor your father, but all men who act as a father figure. Stepfathers, uncles, grandfathers, and adult male friends are all honored on Father's Day.
