Scott has led a group of 12 students (9 girls, 3 boys) to Belize. Scott gave an excellent slideshow of the beauty of this South American province. Scott also brought Adam and Dana who went on the trip. Adam counted 88 bug bites on himself.

Belize (formerly British Honduras) is a constitutional monarchy, and the northernmost Central American nation. Belize has a diverse society, comprising many cultures and languages. Belize is the only country in Central America where English is the official language. Belize is bordered to the north by Mexico, south and west by Guatemala, and to the east by the Caribbean Sea. Belize's mainland is about 180 miles long and 68 miles wide.

With 8,867 square miles of land and a population of only 333,200 people (2010 est.), Belize possesses the lowest population density in Central America. The country's population growth rate of 2.21% (2008 est.), however, is the highest in the region and one of the highest in the western hemisphere. Belize's abundance of terrestrial and marine species, and its diversity of ecosystems give it a key place within the globally significant Mesoamerican Biological Corridor.

Belize is culturally unique among its Central American neighbors; it is the only nation in the region with a British colonial heritage. As a part of the Western Caribbean Zone, however, it also shares a common heritage with the Caribbean portions of other Central American countries. Adam Maurey is a rising senior at TCHS. He is active in the marching band and runs on the cross country and track teams. Adam aspires to major in Environmental Studies in college, to someday run from the Pacific to the Atlantic and is considering joining the Peace Corp.

Dana Tran just completed her junior year at TCHS. She will serve as the ASB president for the 2011-2012 school year. Dana plans to major in Communications in college. She someday hopes to start a non-profit organization that would benefit the underserved and also would someday like to join the Peace Corp.
