The program was Elizabeth Dever from the Pasadena Ronald McDonald House. Elizabeth spoke at our club a few months ago and caused Rich Wenzel to begin our relationship with Meals of Love. Many of our members are participating in providing meals to families that are staying at the house while their child his receiving life saving treatment.

Some things that I learned: The two homes are adjacent to Huntington Memorial Hospital. There are 6 family rooms in one home and 2 in the other. They are beautifully restored 1912 Craftsman style homes that are leased from CalTrans. It costs about \$150 per night to house a family. They ask for a nominal \$15 donation per night if they can afford it. Families usually come from within a radius of 25 miles, but they also have international families. 20% of the funding comes from McDonald franchises, vendors, and customer donations.

Families staying at the Pasadena Ronald McDonald House during these stress filled times are cared for in a supportive, comfortable environment. They are able to cook, do laundry, telecommute, relax and share experiences with other families.

I inadvertently reported last week that Chuck Shaw was at his time share at Kaiser. It was Chuck Souder (how was I supposed to know, they both have beards). Anyway, Chuck Shaw said he is feeling much better now. I know I am!
