The California condor (*Gymnogyps californianus*) is the largest bird in North America, and once dominated the western skies. Sadly, the species declined throughout much of the 20th century until only drastic measures could save it from extinction.

The California condor is one of our nation's most magnificent birds, with wings spanning an amazing nine and half feet! It is black in color with white underwing patches and sports a bald head with very few feathers. The color of the head varies from white to reddish purple. The bare head is an adaptation for hygiene since they eat dead and rotting meat and must, for the most part, stick their heads into the carcasses to feed. As unappetizing as this may seem to us, scavengers like condors are vital to the natural ecosystem. They are nature's cleaning crew.

The magnificent birds are indigenous to California flying from Baja to Canada. People often confuse the Condor for the State bird. Actually, it is the Quail. They fly at 30-40 miles per hour looking for animals already hunted. They live for 45-80 years. They can hunt prey for 2,700 square miles at a height of 15,000 feet. They prefer large animals and can go 1-2 weeks without food. They became endangered in 1976 with 22 Condors in California in 1980. In 2013 there were 435. The biggest threat to the big bird is lead from the ammunition that felled its prey.
