Brian went through all the hot topics including Rosemead Improvement Project, The Gateway Project (Rosemead and Las Tunas), the old Alpha Beta site, back-in parking downtown, the old lumber yard on Lower Azusa, the recent purchase of the old Funeral Home at Workman and TC Blvd. Brian also spoke to the Council adopted Reserve Policy which insures that Temple City will be able to continue business for almost two years even if there was no revenue.

Brian explained new projects of three million. The Council wants to leverage its reserves with necessary projects at this time. In this economy it makes more sense to begin these projects with the minimal interest of \$35M a year for its reserves. Temple City is on course for 10 major projects in 10 years.

Temple City is poised to go from a good city to a great city. Our City was in the news a few years ago for all the wrong reasons. Now Temple City is making news with 7 recent awards that go from planning to communications. Temple City is lucky to have great leadership, including a dedicated staff and interns.
