LAST TUESDAY

Jane Chavez is the new Executive Director of the Pregnancy Help Center of San Gabriel Valley. The center is located on Rosemead Blvd. just south of Las Tunas Drive

Jane's father was in the military and she grew up moving and living all over the world. Jane attended High School in Augsburg, Germany. Jane has been married to newly elected council member Tom for 32 years with two grown sons.

The Center provides a valuable service to young ladies who think they are pregnant. Some of the free services they provide are pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, confidential counseling, 24-hour helpline, material assistance for mother and baby, referrals for medical and housing, support groups, and post abortion counseling.

From January to May they had 718 visits, 216 pregnancy tests, and 48 ultrasounds. During this time they provided counseling and advice to young women who are confused and abortion minded. There are 750,000 teen pregnancies each year in the United States. 3,500 young women decide to abort the life that is living in them EACH DAY.

The Center is a non-profit and is supported by organizations and individuals and are always in need of baby items for their clients. Jane is passionate about her duties at the center and is not bashful about bringing the spiritual into decisions. They begin each day at the Center in prayer.

The Mission Statement is: "The Pregnancy Help Center of San Gabriel Valley affirms the dignity of life by providing sound alternatives to abortion and support for women experiencing crisis pregnancies."

I really hope checks are made to assure accuracy.

Amendments were passed regarding how we can pay for insurance, dates for dues payments to International and dues freezes for low income countries of the world. One amendment failed thus continuing the practice of spouses not being required to pay for a second magazine subscription.
