Noting that Jim Enkelaar has appropriately provided for the appearance of Abigail Adams, I asked U.S. history buff, Sara, to tell us about Abigail. Here we go!
"Abigail Adams was an extraordinary woman for any time. Though she lacked much formal education, her intelligence, high principles and courage were used to advise and support her husband, John, in his efforts to create our constitution and guide our country through its uncertain beginning. During John's work on the constitution she wrote him not to forget to consider the needs of women.

"She strongly opposed slavery and freed the slaves she was given. She encouraged her husband to take on tasks even through it meant he had to leave her alone to run their farm while he worked for our country in Philadelphia and France. Later she joined him in France and then England where she helped him deal with being rudely treated.

"Throughout their lengthy marriage they wrote letters constantly addressing each other as 'dearest friend.' She was his truest consultant."
