Jeffrey brought a wide array of rocks that he passed around including a meteorite that is millions of years old.

Our planet earth is more than 2,000 million years old. We have just celebrated the Second Millenium which is 2,000 years and we think that is a long time! But it is nothing compared to the age of our planet.

Almost all of the earth's surface is made up of rock covered with a thin layer of soil. The oldest rocks are over 800 million years old and have been formed over the years from deposits of sand, clay, mud and the skeletons of tiny animals.

But all rocks are not the same. There are rocks under the ground and on the ground. There are rocks by the sea and under the sea. There are large rocks, there are small rocks and pebbles. Pebbles are small pieces of rock that have broken off and have been worn smooth by the weather and the sea.

Some rocks do not allow water to pass through them. These are called IMPERMEABLE rocks. Some rocks allow water to pass through them. These are called PERMEABLE rocks.
