Five signers were captured by the British as traitors, and tortured before they died. Twelve had their homes ransacked and burned.

Carter Braxton of Virginia, a wealthy planter and trader, saw his ships swept from the seas by the British Navy. He sold his home and properties to pay his debts, and died in rags.

John Hart was driven from his wife's bedside. She was dying. His fields and his gristmill were laid to waste. For more than a year he lived in forests and caves, returning home to find that his wife had died and his children vanished.
