Lucy has a passion for the Neighborhood Watch and CERT (Community Emergency Response Team). Neighborhood Watch takes place each month for 10 months. It is a community meeting in 10 different areas of Temple City. Temple City Sheriff's explain how you can be safe. City staff on hand to help us with Community Preservation.

There are 177 volunteers who have gone through CERT training. Members are trained to help mitigate problems during the first 72 hours following a disaster. The CERT program provides private citizens with basic skills that will enable them to handle their own needs and then to respond to their community's needs in the aftermath of a disaster. The training takes 20 hours spread over three days.
