Her demonstrated ability to mobilize a wide variety of stakeholders and develop partnerships at the local, state, federal and international levels has thoroughly prepared her to carry out the duties and responsibilities as the Executive Director for Grandparents As Parents, which in turn, will result in improved services to its caregivers, stakeholders, children, youth and families across Los Angeles County. Over 600,000 California children and teens are living in homes not headed by their parents.
