Chuck gave the history of the Dr. Gil Sefton Foundation. Many of our members probably have never heard of Gil Sefton. Gil was a Temple City optometrist and club President in 1948 and Lt. Governor in 1959. We don't know when he passed away as he willed \$5,000 seed money for the low cost student loan foundation. Dr. Sefton was committed to the furthering of students going on to higher education. The loan was for \$1,000 at a simple interest of 2% to be repaid over 4 years after graduation.

The Board will take up the continuance of the Foundation as it has been dormant for several years. No one knows but the Foundation funds may be about \$20,000. Our Kiwanis Club is a 501 (c) 4 organization which allows you to deduct your Kiwanis donations as a business expense. The Sefton Foundation is a 501 (c) 3 which allows you to deduct your contributions as a charitable donation.
