Nat Read gave a history lesson on California. He told of the second Mayor of Los Angeles, Benjamin "Don Benito" Wilson. He was known as "Don Benito" because of his benevolent manner in his treatment of Indian affairs.

Wilson became the first non-Hispanic owner of Rancho San Pasqual, which encompassed today's towns of Pasadena, Altadena, South Pasadena, Alhambra, San Marino, and San Gabriel. Wilson was the second elected Mayor of Los Angeles for one term, Los Angeles County Supervisor and served three terms as a California State Senator.

His marriage to his second wife, Margaret Hereford produced a daughter Ruth who would later be mother to General George S Patton Jr. commander of U.S. and allied forces during World War II.

At one time there 6,000 people in LA County, now there is 10 million. At one time Los Angeles was the most dangerous city in the United States with the same amount of murders with 6,000 or 10 million.

Nat Read has an impressive resume: He was an exchange student to the USSR soon after the U-2 incident, was a navy deck officer at the Vietnam Tonkin Gulf incident, rose to captain; declined promotion to rear admiral, preached in small Presbyterian churches in Texas and Oklahoma, marched with Dr. Martin Luther King, has written for Wall Street Journal, Reader's Digest, Good Housekeeping, Saturday Evening Post, and LA Times,

He wrote an article causing Mayor Daley to kill Chicago Magazine, made his living as a cartoonist, cab driver, Nevada casino worker, was an LAPD reserve cop working gang suppression in Watts, Hollywood vice, downtown foot beat. He appeared as a stand-up comic at Improv, Ice House, and others. All I can say is WOW!!

Mr. Happy (Mike Miller) reports that \$178.00 worth of ice cream was consumed at the Concerts in the Park last Wednesday. Mike is still figuring out the Barbecue.
