LAST TUESDAY

Deputy Rich Soto is a 19 year veteran of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's. He arrived at Temple Station in 1996 and has been a member of the Special Assignment Team since 2000. The team previously had 4 deputies but are now 2 because of cut backs. The team deals with quality of life issues in Temple City.

Temple City is relatively low in crime with a residential burglary about every 3-4 days while other contract cities in the area are experiencing about 15 a day. Half the burglaries happen because of an open window or door. Gang activity has decreased with overall crime down especially the last 3 months.

Deputy Soto attributes the low crime to concerned citizens who watch out for each other. If you are wondering why crime is not reported in the press it is because there is so little to report. If you ever want to know you can visit the "Press Board" at the station. It is available to anyone.

We are fortunate to have dedicated deputies at the Station including Captain Richard Shaw, Sergeant Tony Osterman, Deputy Rick Adams, and Deputy Rich Soto. These are public servants who are dedicated to protecting our quality of life.

Bill Hohl paid \$5.00 for being a member for 12 years. I guess the \$5.00 was for each year of the 12 that he was happy. Doug Sears paid \$\$ for Rich Soto and Doug both being USC fans.

President Chuck Souder reports that after 5 concerts in the park, our famous soft-serve ice cream has netted the club \$728.00. Now if we could only have the machine pump out the product a little faster.

Guest of the club Dan Arrighi visited us and was almost immediately approved for Kiwanis education and membership. Dan and President Chuck could not say they were members of another service club that started with an "R". Deputy Rich Soto was being very diplomatic by suggested that it rhymed with Notary. Dan is one of those guys that uses his talents, gifts, service, and funds to help promote the youth of our city. Dan would be a tremendous asset to our club. After all we would now have 2 water company executives who know how to barbecue and do pancakes. It doesn't get any better than this except for lower water rates.
