THIS TUESDAY

Jessica Privett is a pilot and will talk about the history of El Monte airport. El Monte Airport has 365 based aircraft and experiences over 158,000 annual operations. It is home to a state-of-the-art FAA air traffic control tower, three FBO/flight schools, aircraft maintenance facilities, flying clubs and several local law enforcement helicopter operations. The Airport is often the backdrop for the nearby motion picture industry. El Monte Airport's runway, 1/19, is 3,995 feet long and 75 feet wide and is in excellent condition. It is equipped with medium intensity runway lighting (MIRL), precision approach path indicators (PAPI) and runway end indicator lights (REIL).

The airport has recently undergone some significant upgrades, such as comprehensive runway lighting and signage improvements and perimeter fencing on the west side of the airfield. The construction of a 7,650 square foot administrative building was completed in August 2001 and serves airport patrons and the community with a restaurant, a pilot's lounge, airport mgt. offices and a multi-purpose meeting area.

Ann Marie Piersol is a consultant with Security Design Systems. She came from a career with the LAPD and has been with SDS for 13 years. Ann Marie lives in South Pasadena and is a member of the Glendale Kiwanis Club.

Ann Marie began her presentation unusually by conducting a question and answer time before her talk. I thought it was very effective because some times we don't have the time to ask our favorite questions after.

I will preface my remarks by saying that SDS is my alarm company by choice. Their owner Joe Petrillo is a former LA County Sheriff with the knowledge to recommend just the right security system.
