Bryan Cook is the City Manager for Temple City. Bryan will celebrate his 1 year anniversary on September 15.

"Bryan was among 35 applicants who clearly stood out as the next generation of city managers who offer fresh and creative approaches to leading municipalities and the communities they serve," Mayor Carl Blum said. "The City Council is thrilled to have attracted someone of Bryan's caliber."

Bryan previously served as assistant city manager/finance director for South Gate, a full-service city of 90,000 people located southeast of downtown Los Angeles. He has over 15 years of municipal experience including capacities as assistant to the City Manager and interim Parks and Recreation director. He is 43 years old. He and his wife live in Pasadena with their seven-year-old son.

During his tenure in South Gate, Bryan was instrumental in boosting the municipality's credit rating from BB to A-, and taking the General Fund reserve from a deficit to over \$10 million. Bryan holds a master's degree in public administration from California State University, East Bay and a bachelor's degree in political science from California State University, Los Angeles.

Bryan came from a city that had its own problems as we had. The one thing that convinced him that Temple City was different was the Protocols and Ethics that elected officials and commissioners adhere to.

Some of the topics Bryan covered were water and the continuing drought. Once we have a big rain everyone thinks the drought over but it takes 4-6 months for the water to percolate through the ground aquifer. Temple City's crime blotter for two weeks looks like one day in surrounding cities. We are the 37th safest city in California. Of the 88 cities in California we rank 3rd in property values.

New businesses are investing in Temple City. Things have changed though, for the first time online sales are outpacing brick and mortar. Who ever thought that Gold's Gym would be replacing 150,000 square feet of retail space at Santa Anita Westfield Mall.

Temple City is beginning a Pavement Management Plan that will repair over 1,000,000 square feet of roads this year alone. Our Sheriff's do a great job of taking care of quality of life issues and crime. We are fortunate to have three deputies assigned to Temple City, Rick Adams, Joe Zuniga, and Van Tran. Captain Carone Jacob and Sergeant Ron Miranda are always there for us. The City is in the process of a General Plan Update with the emphasis on R-1 single family.

We still need helpers at our booth for the Concerts in the Park on Wednesday nights. Please see Steve Montesanti or Jim Robuck for more details. Our last concert is August 26.
