Rosemarie Boerger and Steve Gunther from Maryvale were our program for the day. Rosemarie is Vice President of Development & Communications. Steve is Executive Director.

The Maryvale Family Resource & Early Education Center opened February 7, 2011 in response to the growing need for licensed child care in the San Gabriel Valley. The Center, built on the site of the former Maryvale Child Care Center with increased licensing from 57 to 148 children, they provide an affordable, high-quality, child development program for children, ages 6 weeks to Kindergarten. There is also before and after care for school age children.

Maryvale was established when the Daughters of Charity were asked by Bishop Amat to come from Maryland to care for the growing number of orphaned children living in the streets of the then El Pueblo de Los Angeles. After a lengthy journey over land and sea, the Daughters arrived in January 1856 and set about caring for these children.

For 155 years the Daughters of Charity have lovingly cared for Los Angeles' children, honoring their long-ago commitment to Bishop Amat and faithfully following the mission of their founder, St. Vincent de Paul to "assist the poor in every way." Over the years, thousands of children have found safety and hope in the love and arms of the Sisters as they cared for them at The Los Angeles Orphan Asylum - renamed Maryvale in 1953.

Maryvale provides a circle of care that also includes Residential Based Services, Mental Health, Transitional Housing, and After Care programs.

Guests in attendance were Sue Matchett's cousin Annett from Cincinnati, Bob Rodenbucher, Ron Dorazio's grandsons Maxwell and Benjamin Clark, and incoming Lt. Governor Ernie Arnold from South Pasadena Kiwanis. His theme will of course focus on membership, but he is also concerned about member retention and member experience. Mike Miller reported a gross income of \$187 last week from ice cream sales at the concerts. Jerry and Mary Backstrom are proud of their new grandson.

Steve Tyre was very appreciative of the club and their concern for Norm at his passing. Steve gave his remembrances of his father to our club, especially when we changed venues by making sure there was handicap access and parking. Norm was quite a guy and will be missed greatly, he made it a priority to attend meetings coming all the way from Toluca Lake.

Our club celebrated 72 years of community service on August 8th.
