Our own member Superintendent Dr. Joan Hillard and Chief Business Official David Jaynes gave us the state of the school system.

Well, some thing never change. There is no state budget in place so the district must use reserve funds to keep the district afloat. The state requires the district to have a "placeholder" budget for the new school year by June 30th. Hopefully Arnold and his bunch will do the right thing and not imitate former Gov. Gray Davis.

Some of the changes taking place in the district are: TCHS Principal Ray Plutko retired. TCHS Dean's Mike Mooney and Sam Oramas have moved on to another district. Kevin Herrington and Kyle Douglas are the new Dean's. Lawton Gray is the new Principal at Oak Avenue. Terry Scholte is the new Vice-Principi at Longden. A new Principal at TCHS is close to being announced.

School Board Elections will take place soon with 4 candidates for 3 positions . Late Breaking News, Dan Arrighi has taken out papers for one of the contested seats.

The bond of 1998 was originally 24 million and leveraged to 31 million of improvements with the major portion being spent at the Elementary schools. The current proposal is for a 55 million bond to be paid over 30 years with a costs of \$40 per \$100,000 of assessed value to each piece of property.

A good portion of the bond money if passed will be used for health and safety of the schools including repairing damaged concrete, ADA curb cuts, bracing gas lines, replacing windows, roofing, repair termite damage, provide rubberized play surfaces, replace non-compliant play apparatus, upgrade toilets for ADA, modernize gym at Oak Avenue, remove and replace 9X9 asbestos floor tiles, replace swimming pool at the High School, provide a great venue for performing arts.

These are just some of the things that need to be done. Items for each school will be prioritized. If the district could make all the repairs it would take approximately 150 million.
