We welcome back Rich Wenzel who will give a visual tour of The Reno Air Races. The Reno Air Races, also known as the National Championship Air Races, take place each September at the Reno Stead Airport a few miles north of Reno, Nevada, USA. Air racing is billed as 'the world's fastest motor sport'.

LAST TUESDAY

Jerry Backstrom gave an armchair tour of Colonial Williamsburg, Jamestown, Yorktown, Montecello, and Washington DC..

Colonial Williamsburg is the private foundation representing the historic district of the city of Williamsburg, Virginia, USA. The district includes buildings dating from 1699 to 1780 which made colonial Virginia's capital. The capital straddled the boundary of the original shires of Virginia — James City Shire (now James City County), and Charles River Shire (now York County).

For most of the 18th century, Williamsburg was the center of government, education and culture in the Colony of Virginia. George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Patrick Henry, James Monroe, James Madison, George Wythe, Peyton Randolph, and others molded democracy in the Commonwealth of Virginia and the United States here. The motto of Colonial Williamsburg is "The future may learn from the past." The Historic Area is an interpretation of a Colonial American city, with exhibits including dozens of authentic or re-created colonial houses and relating to American Revolutionary War history.

Prominent buildings include the Raleigh Tavern, the Capitol, The Governor's Palace (all reconstructed), and Bruton Parish Church (original). Rather than an effort to preserve antiquity, the combination of restoration and re-creation of the entire colonial town attempts to re-create the atmosphere and the ideals of 18th-century American people and revolutionary leaders. Interpreters work and dress as they did in the era, using colonial grammar and diction (although not colonial accents).

Guests in attendance were John and Sue Chandler's son Peter. Many thanks to Peter for being so kind and patient to his father John. Tom McIntee brought Marie Leonard, Key Club Lt. Governor Vivian Luu asked for chaperone help at the car wash this weekend.

Congratulations to Chuck Shaw for being awarded the San Gabriel Valley Association's Water Mark Award. Chuck is very deserving of this award after devoting his entire career to water. Now if he could only win an award for restoring classic cars and getting a hole-in-one like Mike Miller.
