Bali is an island and province of Indonesia. The province includes the island of Bali and a few smaller neighboring islands, notably Nusa Penida, Nusa Lembongan, and Nusa Ceningan. It is located at the westernmost end of the Lesser Sunda Islands, between Java to the west and Lombok to the east. Its capital of Denpasar is located at the southern part of the island.

With a population of 3,890,757 in the 2010 census,[4] and currently 4,225,000 as of January 2014, the island is home to most of Indonesia's Hindu minority. According to the 2010 Census, 83.5% of Bali's population adhered to Balinese Hinduism, 13.4% to Islam, 2.5% Christianity and 0.5% to Buddhism.

Bali is a popular tourist destination and is renowned for its highly developed arts, including traditional and modern dance, sculpture, painting, leather, metalworking, and music. The Indonesian International Film Festival is held every year in Bali. Since the late 20th century, the province has had a rise in tourism.

Bali is part of the Coral Triangle, the area with the highest biodiversity of marine species. In this area alone over 500 reef building coral species can be found. For comparison, this is about 7 times as many as in the entire Caribbean. There is a wide range of dive sites with high quality reefs, all with their own specific attractions. Many sites can have strong currents and swell, so diving without a knowledgeable guide is inadvisable. Most recently, Bali was the host of the 2011 ASEAN Summit, 2013 APEC and Miss World 2013.

In his effort towards his Eagle Scout rank Christian Palomares headed up a team of hard working scouts from Troop 169, 167, 161, and students from Temple City High School and Football. The task was to remove all the items in the storage bin, scrape, clean, and paint the inside. Shelving was installed making the space much more organized.

In case you were wondering about this 15 year-old 6'4" young man, allow me to tell you a little about him: Christian is the Sophomore Class President at TCHS, a Class president for three years and member of Student Leadership for six years. At TCHS he is involved as a Peer Listener, Junior States of America and String Bassist in Honors Orchestra. This year he will be involved in Honors English, Chemistry and Advanced Placement World History.

Outside of the High School he is a member in the Philharmonic orchestra, the top ensemble in the Pasadena Youth Symphony Orchestras. (An associate of the Pasadena Symphony Association).
