The Terracotta Army was discovered in 1974 in the eastern suburbs of Xi'an Shaanxi Province by local farmers. The terracotta figures dating from 210 BC. The figures vary in height at about 6 feet, according to their role, the tallest being the generals. The figures include strong warriors, chariots, horses, officials, acrobats, strongmen, and musicians. Current estimates are that in the three pits containing the Terracotta Army there were over 8,000 soldiers, 130 chariots with 520 horses and 150 calvary horses, the majority of which are still buried in the pits.
