This is not a volunteer job. When he started in 2000 he made \$7.65 an hour and ended his career in 2009 at \$12.50 an hour. He needed to be there 2 hours before the game and 20 minutes after the game. He does not know how much all the signed balls are worth as his daughter threw him a fast ball and said they were hers when he meets the big Dodger in the sky.
