Raymond Medina with Brothers Plating will talk about his experience running a business that has to deal with government agency's like the EPA. Editor Note: Listen to his tale of woes, and I will tell you mine.

LAST TUESDAY

Dad, better known as Norm Tyre introduced his son. John Tyre is a certified specialist in criminal law, one of only forty in all of Los Angeles County. Being a specialist means that he has received extra training and has demonstrated to the court system that he can handle death penalty cases.

John explained that 1st degree murder does not qualify for the death penalty. The death penalty is reserved for special circumstances with the crime. The only two options are life without parole or the death penalty.

You need more appellate attorneys. 700+ people are on death row now. 200+ do not have appellate attorneys. It takes 6-8 years to get your appellate attorney.

San Quentin is the place where they are kept, with 23 hours of cell time and 1 hour free time. If you have 395 million you can build a new prison. Death penalty cases cost an average of 1.4 million to take to trial. It cost \$95,000 per year to make sure the alleged scum bag is comfortable. Each prisoner has his own guard.
