Tutor Doctor's motto is "We make House Calls". They offer one-on-one tutoring in the home. Their Tutor's are not credentialed like teachers in our school system. Depending on how many hours you buy the fee is between \$45 and \$55 per hour. The tutor is an independent contractor and receives anywhere between \$15 and \$20 per hour, not including travel, taxes, lesson plans, reporting, benefits, workman's comp., etc.

I think this could be a good business plan for someone that is in firmed or disabled. Otherwise there is a tutoring office on several corners in Temple City.
