OUR CLUB'S DONATION HELPS SAVE A LIFE

Well...do you remember the \$3,000 we donated to help purchase a defibrillator a while back? Well...it finally paid dividends...big time!.

A Temple City High School student who collapsed on campus was saved by the quick use of the defibrillator. The 16 year-old junior had just run a warm-up lap in his gym class when he sat down on a bench and collapsed. A teacher noticed the student was having difficulty breathing and was turning different shades of blue and purple before he passed out. Our own member, Janice Murasko said after paramedics arrived "they said it was a good thing the school had one because they wouldn't have arrived in time to save the student's life."

While one teacher administered CPR to the student, another ran to get school nurse Rita Delgado and the defibrillator. Principal Ray Plutko said the device tells users how to operate it and the student required one electrical jolt. "It saved his life," he said. "You can see it's worth its weight in gold. Every campus should have one. If you use it only once in 50 years, it's worth it."
