THIS TUESDAY

"California At War"

In the weeks after Pearl Harbor submarines of the Japanese Imperial Navy torpedoed ships and refineries off the California coast. Crewmen were killed, ships sank, and panic took over. This panic led to what is now known as the "Battle of Los Angeles." Only one man died in this imagined invasion but thirty people were arrested the next day, twenty of them Japanese Americans.

Prejudice wasn't new in California, but in the name of "patriotism" it reached new heights. Best known is the internment of more than 100,000 Japanese, but even the state's oldest population, the Latinos of Mexican and Spanish decent, became targets.

LAST TUESDAY

Superintendent Dr. Joan Hillard and Administrative Assistant Lynne Burkardt presented the state of the schools in Temple City and the proposed bond issue.

In 1998 a 24 million bond to improve facilities was approved by the voters. With careful planning, refinancing, and grants that amount swelled to 31.8 million. The bulk of the monies used were at the K-6 level with not too much being used at the High School. This time I think a good deal of the funds will be used at the High School.

The School Board has been updating the Master Plan for the past 1½ years. The Master Plan identified more than 155 million needed to bring the schools to a higher standard. Proposition 39 allows a thresh hold of only 55.5 million for the bond.

Because of a flattening of enrollment the bond would not qualify for new buildings. The monies should only be used for repairs, maintenance, health and safety issues.

The State mandates that classrooms be at least 900 square feet. Some classrooms at Temple City High School are less than 500 square feet.

The average increase in property taxes to fund the bond will be approximately \$90 per household, per year.

Dr. Hillard left us with the thought "Teach for the future!"
