Michael Forbes is the Community Development Director for Temple City. In my personal opinion besides our City Manager Bryan Cook, Michael Forbes is involved in almost every aspect of our City.

Michael and his wife live in Pasadena and previously served in Burbank and Glendora. He received his higher education at UCLA which made a few people happy.

Michael did a great job giving us updates on current projects which included Linden Walk Housing on Lower Azusa, Camellia Square Shopping Center at Las Tunas and Rosemead Blvd. This is an eight-year project that should be completed sometime in 2016. There is 80,000 square feet of office, retail, and restaurant space. So far there are 7 restaurants approved for occupancy. If you like Chinese, Korean, and Vietnamese food you will be real happy.

Other major projects on the burner are the Las Tunas Drive Enhancement Project and the former Alpha Beta site on Temple City Blvd for 27 years. Public hearings will take place in early 2016 for this long awaited project consisting of 75 condominiums above 17,000 s.f. of retail below. All of this is happening while there is a General Plan Update and Specific Plan. The General Plan is a blueprint for future development, and the Specific Plan will focus on future redevelopment of the K-Mart center and surrounding area.

Guest in attendance were Marie Leonard and Lisa Montesanti. Frank Ruedel was also on hand as a Guest of the Club. Ernie Arnold's Lt. Governor Installation will be on Friday, October 9, at the Rosemead Community Center Room 1, 3936 N Muscatel, Rosemead. It will start at 6:00 PM and will cost \$25.
