The American Cancer Society will speak to us about a topic that we all need to hear about, Prostate Cancer. Prostate cancer is the most common non-skin cancer in America, affecting 1 in 6 men. The older you are, the more likely you are to be diagnosed with prostate cancer. Although only 1 in 10,000 under age 40 will be diagnosed, the rate shoots up to 1 in 38 for ages 40 to 59, and 1 in 15 for ages 60 to 69. In fact, more than 65% of all prostate cancers are diagnosed in men over the age of 65.

LAST TUESDAY

Temple City resident Julie Ly with the US Census Bureau is the Deputy Regional Director for the Los Angeles Regional Census Center which covers Hawaii and California.

Julie is a 22 year veteran of the Census Bureau. In the 2000 Census she was responsible for field data collection, administration, recruiting, space leasing, geography and coverage measurement.

Responses to the Census are protected by law. Nobody - not IRS, ICE, FBI, or Homeland Security can see your answers. The 2010 Census will only be using the short form that ask only 7 questions. The Census is important, the data is used for Congressional Apportionment and Redistricting. Over 430 billion each year in Federal funds are distributed based on the results each year. 3.8 million Census takers will be hired to knock on doors with a pay scale of about \$18 to \$24 per hour. For every 1% of response it costs 80 million dollars. Leave it to the Fed's to begin Census Day on April 1, 2010. April fools!
