Jim Elliot was only 29 years old when he was killed by the Auca Indians on the Curaray River in Ecuador. He went there as a missionary in 1956 to bring the gospel and evangelizing Ecuador's Quechua Indians. Elliot and four other missionaries were killed by the people they came to help. They all had weapons but pre-determined to not use them even if their life was in danger.

Missions has changed dramatically in recent years with missionaries from other countries coming to America. The country sending the most is South Korea. The quote most attributed to Elliot was found in his journal on October 28, 1949 that expresses his belief "He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain that which he cannot lose."
