Susan Rosvall was our speaker for the day. She wrote a novel about her brother's account of the Vietnam War. In January of 1966, naive young Private William Scofield takes his place on a seven-man howitzer crew at Phu Loi base camp, Vietnam. Conflict begins immediately when he encounters head of the gun crew, Sergeant Clifford Moore, an illiterate Klansman from rural Alabama. Enraged by Scofield's very presence as a draftee from a liberal, middle-class family in California, Moore launches a series of increasingly homicidal attacks against him. Scofield gains respect and credibility among the men when he confronts his nemesis. But he does not emerge a true hero until enemy soldiers bearing AK-47's attack the battery through a grove of young rubber trees. In an adrenalin-filled act of courage and self-sacrifice, Scofield saves the lives of eighty men, including Moore's. Swirling with local color and hard facts, the novel reveals a compelling story of survival, growth, and heroism, grounded in the history of the times.
