Temple City resident Melissa Hudson and her Guide Dog Anya told of her experience of virtually going blind and the joy of receiving her own dog to help her with life. Melissa and Anya have been together for 4 years.

Guide Dogs for the Blind have been in existence since the 1940's and originally helped only veterans. They exist on private donations with no Federal funds. 80% of the dogs are either black or yellow labs, the balance are Shepherds. The average guide dog works for 10 years.

Melissa spoke of how she and Anya are not always treated well when they frequent business establishments. Guide dogs are always permitted to accompany their handlers anywhere the public is allowed. We thank Sue Matchett for securing Melissa to speak to us about her experience.

VETERANS DAY

Veterans Day is an American holiday honoring military veterans. Both a federal holiday and a state holiday in all states, it is celebrated on the same day as Armistice Day or Remembrance Day in other parts of the world, falling on November 11, the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I. (Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 with the German signing of the Armistice.)

Veterans Day is largely intended to thank living veterans for their service, to acknowledge that their contributions to United States national security are appreciated, and to underscore the fact that all those who served - not only those who died - have sacrificed and done their duty. The holiday is commonly misprinted as Veteran's Day or Veterans' Day in calendars and advertisements.
