THIS TUESDAY

Program Chairman Chuck Souder is calling in all his municipal favors this month. Los Angeles County Sheriff's Rick Adams and Rich Soto will give us the latest on crime statistics in our fair city.

LAST TUESDAY

Executive Vice President, Dennis Chippeta with Athens Services gave us the story of Materials Recovery Facility (MRF). Tons of recyclable materials are extracted annually to meet AB939 recycling goals and delivered to post-consumer markets.

Dennis came prepared to trash talk with all the facts and figures. Dennis admits that he always thought of trash disposal as being a dirty business, that was until he received his first paycheck.

Athens exclusively serves 17 communities and another 32 cities. The landfill at the 60 freeway and Paramount Blvd is the sight of the largest super fund clean-up at the tune of \$880 million.

Puente Hills landfill is the only public "dump" that is still able to receive our excess. They are limited to 13,200 tons of trash a day. They usually close the gate at about 10:00 a.m. each day. This landfill be shuttered in the year 2013. What will we do?

Temple City is required to recycle at the rate of 50%. Dennis reports that TC is at the 61% mark. Probably not helped my all the people going through Bob Tyler's trash prior to pick-up.

Temple City's Community Disposal was purchased by Athens when Chet Otting decided he was not ready to take the next step that was necessary, recycling. We Armenian's stick together. Owner of Athens, Jack Arakelian was married to my mother-in-law's first cousin. My father-in-law was in the trash business. My wife Pat had the stigma of being called names at school because her father was in the "trash business".
